

## Online funeral collections

An online funeral page is a way for family and friends to donate to a funeral collection in memory of someone special.

You can add photos and videos or share memories. You can also add details of the funeral and post a link to a live stream for anyone who is unable to attend.

## Donating in memory

You can make a donation directly to the charity in memory via our Snowdrop tribute wall where you can also add a message and, if you wish, a photo.

## Making a regular gift

Setting up a monthly donation is a lovely way to remember someone whilst also supporting other bereaved families. When you sign up you will receive a snowdrop pin badge and regular updates about our work.

## Snowdrop tribute pages

Online Snowdrop tribute pages can be set up as a place to collect donations or fundraise in memory of someone important to you, or simply as a special place for you to remember them.

Friends and family can share photos, videos and memories to celebrate their life. There is the function to light online candles, add virtual gifts and to make the page as unique as they were.

You can also use the page to share details of the funeral or organise events to remember your special person.

Tributes are free to set up and can remain open for as long as you like.



After Jayne's husband Paul died, an online Snowdrop tribute page was opened in his memory where family and friends could find information about the funeral, share photos and messages, and make donations.

**Paul's colleagues and friends also walked 25km in his memory, raising £45,500 for Child Bereavement UK.**



## The significance of snowdrops

Snowdrops have traditionally been associated with remembrance: the first flowers to appear after winter, they signify renewal and hope. In 2001, the charity held its first Snowdrop Walk where families enjoyed a walk in beautiful surroundings and planted snowdrops in remembrance. This has become an annual event held in Buckinghamshire and families return each year to remember someone special to them.

We used Paul's tribute to fundraise for Child Bereavement UK, a charity that directly benefits his children. We were touched by the generosity of those who donated, including many who didn't know us well but wanted to show their support.
